1. DEFINITIONS

In these Criteria, the following words have the following respective meanings:

“Criteria”	means this Selection Criteria Supplement.
“Performance Standard”	means the performance standard (PS) used by PA to guide selection decisions to a national Team in addition to any other criteria as set out in clause 6 of this Criteria.
“PA”	means Paddle Australia Ltd, the recognised governing body for Paddling in Australia.
“Policy”	means the Selection Procedures Policy adopted by the Board of PA from time to time that governs the selection of athletes to PA Teams.
“Team”	means the 2023 PA Canoe Sprint World Cup/Championships Team to compete at the 2023 Canoe Sprint World Cups and/or 2023 Canoe Sprint World Championships.

Words not defined in these Criteria have the meaning ascribed to them in the [Constitution](#) of PA or the Policy unless a contrary meaning appears from the context.

2. SELECTION AIMS

To give context to the following Criteria and processes, the aims of the PA High Performance Program for the 2023 season are as follows:

- a) Select Australia’s best athletes to represent PA at international competitions referred to in these Criteria and qualify the maximum number of quota positions for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games; and
- b) provide potential Paris 2024 and LA 2028 athletes, an opportunity to compete in ICF International competitions.

3. SELECTION PROCEDURES

3.1 SELECTION PANEL

In accordance with the Policy, the Selection Panel members are:

- David Foureux - PA GM Performance, Canoe Sprint and Paracanoe (Chair)
- Kim Crane - PA National Performance Director
- Lyndsie Krishnamoorthy (nee Fogarty) – Retired Athlete
- Steve Bird – Retired Athlete

3.2 ELIGIBILITY

- 3.2.1. To be eligible for consideration for selection to the Team, athletes must comply with the Policy.
- 3.2.2. Athletes must be born on or before 31st December 2008 to be eligible for consideration for Team selection.
- 3.2.3. Athletes must have nominated for the Team under clause 3.3 of these Criteria.
- 3.2.4. Except in the case of extenuating circumstances or event cancellation, athletes must compete at both the:
 - a) the Selection Competition - GP2, Penrith NSW (15th – 19th February 2023) and
 - b) 2023 Paddle Australia Canoe Sprint Championships, Champion Lakes WA (21-25 March 2023)

to be eligible for consideration for team selection and to remain eligible for the Team. For the avoidance of doubt, an athlete selected at the Selection Competition at 3.2.4.a) above must attend the event at 3.2.4.b) unless extenuating circumstances are deemed to apply in accordance with Clause 5.
- 3.2.5. To be selected and to remain eligible for the Team, Athletes must attend National Team and Squad camps at the NCE on the Gold Coast and at other locations determined by PA. Athletes selected at the Selection Competition will be expected to be available for the entire period between Monday 27th February and their participation in the World Cups and/or World Championships listed at clause 3.3 below, unless extenuating circumstances are deemed to apply in accordance with clause 5. The exact dates, locations and duration of camps will be confirmed to all athletes selected.
- 3.2.6. Any athlete categorised at Podium Potential or above who has received an invitation to the National Centre of Excellence (NCE), and who chooses not to accept the invitation and relocate before 19th December 2022 will not be considered eligible for selection. Unless extenuating circumstances apply, according to Clause 5.3.
- 3.2.7. Only eligible athletes or crews containing eligible athletes will be considered in the selection process.

3.3 TEAM NOMINATION

- 3.3.1. The competitions for which the Team may be selected for in 2023 include:
 - a) 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Cup 1, 11-14 May 2023, Szeged Hungary
 - b) 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships 23-27 August, Duisburg Germany
 - c) other ICF competitions as may be determined by PA.
- 3.3.2. Athletes will be required to nominate for consideration for selection to the Team. The process of nomination will form part of the entry process for the selection competition listed in clause 3.4 of these Criteria.

- 3.3.3. If, in accordance with clause 7 of these Criteria, the selection competition is cancelled prior to the entry process closing, then Paddle Australia will communicate an alternate nomination process.
- 3.3.4. By nominating for consideration for selection to the Team, athletes agree to comply with:
 - (i) these Criteria; and
 - (ii) the Policy.
- 3.3.5. Given the current global uncertainty due to health concerns, logistical challenges, the war in Ukraine and cost to travel internationally in 2023, PA may choose not to send selected athletes and/or teams to participate in any of the competitions listed in 3.3.1 above. This decision will be at the absolute discretion of the PA Board after consultation with senior management.

3.4 SELECTION COMPETITION

- 3.4.1. The following competition will be utilised as the Selection Competition for considering athletes for selection to the Team:
PA GP2, Penrith NSW - 15th – 19th February 2023
- 3.4.2. As outlined in Clause 7 of these Criteria, the Selection Competition may be postponed or cancelled and any alternate dates and venues for the purpose of selection will be communicated by PA.
- 3.4.3. As per clause 3.2 of the Policy, these Criteria may be amended or repealed by PA at any time and any changes will be communicated by PA.

4. SELECTION CRITERIA & PROCESS

As a priority when selecting the Team, the primary consideration is focused on all Olympic Sprint Canoe and Kayak events and distances on offer at 2024 Paris Olympic Games. To be clear the following events and the number of entries on offer in Paris will be as follows:

MK4 500m x 1 entry MK2 500m x 2 entries MK1 1000m x 2 entries	WK4 500m x 1 entry WK2 500m x 2 entries WK1 500m x 2 entries
MC2 500m x 1 entry MC1 1000m x 2 entries	WC2 500m x 1 entry WC1 200m x 2 entries

It is for this reason Athletes will be selected to the Team based on their performances at the Selection Competition in the following order:

4.1 MENS KAYAK –SELECTION COMPETITION – GP2

- 4.1.1 The first placed eligible Crew in the K4 500m “A” final that achieves the performance standard will be automatically selected.
- 4.1.2 The first placed eligible Crew in the K2 500m “A” final that achieves the performance standard will be automatically selected.

- 4.1.3 The first placed eligible Athlete in the K1 1000m “A” final that achieves the performance standard will be automatically selected.
- 4.1.4 If three (3) or fewer athletes are selected after applying 4.1.1 to 4.1.3 above, the second placed eligible Crew in the K2 500m “A” final that achieves the performance standard will automatically selected.
- 4.1.5 If five (5) or fewer athletes are selected after applying 4.1.1 to 4.1.4 above, the second placed eligible Athlete in the K1 1000m “A” final that achieves the performance standard will be automatically selected.
- 4.1.6 If six (6) or fewer athletes are selected after applying 4.1.1 to 4.1.5 above, the selection panel **MAY** consider adding additional eligible athletes up to a maximum of seven (7) based on the finishing order of the K1 500m. To be considered under this clause athletes must achieve the selection performance standard in the “A” final of the K1 500m.
- 4.1.7 If six (6) or fewer athletes are selected after applying 4.1.1 to 4.1.6 above, the selection panel **MAY** consider adding additional eligible athletes up to a maximum of eight (8) at its absolute discretion. For consideration under 4.1.7 performance in relation to the performance standard may be considered in the discretionary selection process.
- 4.1.8 The Selection Panel is not obliged to add athletes to those automatically selected under clauses 4.1.1 to 4.1.5 above.

2023 Men’s Kayak Performance Standards are:

4.2 WOMEN’S KAYAK –SELECTION COMPETITION – GP2

- 4.2.1 The first placed eligible Crew in the WK4 500m “A” final that achieves the performance standard will be automatically selected.
- 4.2.2 The first placed eligible Crew in the WK2 500m “A” final that achieves the performance standard will be automatically selected.
- 4.2.3 The first placed eligible Athlete in the WK1 500m “A” final that achieves the performance standard will be automatically selected.
- 4.2.4 If three (3) or fewer athletes are selected after applying 4.2.1 to 4.2.3 above, the second placed eligible Crew in the WK2 500m “A” final that achieves the performance standard will automatically selected.

- 4.2.5 If five (5) or fewer athletes are selected after applying 4.2.1 to 4.2.4 above, the second placed eligible Athlete in the WK1 500m “A” final that achieves the performance standard will be automatically selected.
- 4.2.6 If six (6) or fewer athletes are selected after applying 4.2.1 to 4.2.5 above, the selection panel **MAY** consider adding additional eligible athletes up to a maximum of seven (7) based on the finishing order of the K1 500m. To be considered under this clause athletes must achieve the selection performance standard in the “A” final of the WK1 500m.
- 4.2.7 If six (6) or fewer athletes are selected after applying 4.2.1 to 4.2.6 above, the selection panel **MAY** consider adding additional eligible athletes up to a maximum of eight (8) at its absolute discretion. For consideration under 4.2.7 an athlete’s performance in relation to the performance standard may be considered in the discretionary selection process.
- 4.2.8 The Selection Panel is not obliged to add athletes to those automatically selected under clauses 4.2.1 to 4.2.5 above.

4.3 CANOE –SELECTION COMPETITION – GP2

4.3.1 The **first placed eligible Athlete or Crew** in the following Canoe events

- a) WC1 200 “A” final
- b) WC2 500 “A” final
- c) MC1 1000 “A” final
- d) MC2 500 “A” final

who achieves the required performance standard in neutral conditions will gain automatic selection.

4.3.2 the selection panel **MAY** consider adding additional eligible Canoe athletes up to a maximum of three (3) Women’s Canoe and three (3) Men’s Canoe athletes at its absolute discretion. For consideration under 4.3.2 an athlete’s performance in relation to the performance standard may be considered in the discretionary selection process.

4.4 GENERAL

4.4.1 In addition, when considering whether the maximum number of athletes will be selected in each category (Men’s Kayak, Women’s Kayak, Men’s Canoe and Women’s Canoe), the Selection Panel may consider, a combination of, all or none of the following factors (in no specific order of importance or weighting), in its absolute discretion:

- a) relevant factors applicable to Crew combinations, including but not limited to, proven team boat performances, technical compatibility, Crew compatibility, attitude and coachability.
- b) relevant factors applicable to team size, competition schedules and versatility of an athlete to contribute to current and/or future medal outcomes.

When considering which events athletes will race, the panel in consultation with coaches and athletes will prioritise maximising the Teams overall performance. In line with our strategy, this is to ensure maximum Olympic quotas positions can be gained. The decision may be influenced by race scheduling, individual athlete development and program priorities. Winning an event (selection or otherwise) and/or producing a Performance Standard time will not automatically earn the right to race that event at World Cups and/or World Championships.

5. EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES

Notwithstanding anything contained within these Criteria, an Athlete/Crew may apply in writing to the Selection Panel (via the Chair) to have Exceptional Circumstances considered. Such application must incorporate substantive supporting evidence. This application must be received either prior to the Selection Competition beginning, or, as soon as practically possible and no later than 2 hours following the Event in which the Athlete/Crew is applying for Extenuating Circumstances to be considered.

- 5.1 The Selection Panel is not obliged to accept or consider an application under this clause. Only Extenuating Circumstances which prevent an Athlete/Crew from either attending a selection competition, or, finishing an Event which holds selection status, will be considered.
- 5.2 For the purposes of these Criteria, "Extenuating Circumstances" means:
 - a) injury or illness, as confirmed by the PA Chief Medical Officer, or their authorised representative,
 - b) Covid related quarantine requirements, as confirmed by a Medical Officer,
 - c) equipment failure (where applicable),

- d) travel delays, that prevent an Athlete/Crew from attending the selection competition,
- e) bereavement or disability arising from death or serious illness of an immediate family member, and/or
- f) an unanticipated event occurring at the Selection Competition(s).

5.3 To be clear, any postponement, rescheduling or cancellation of a Selection Competition or Event will not be considered as Extenuating circumstances.

5.4 If the Selection Panel accepts an Extenuating Circumstance application, a decision in each case of the weight afforded to the Extenuating Circumstances, will be made by the Selection Panel on an individual basis at its absolute discretion.

6. PERFORMANCE STANDARDS (PS)

6.1 Where it is specified in these Criteria that there is a requirement for an Athlete/Crew to demonstrate the ability to achieve a PS for a relevant Event, the Athlete/Crew will be required to achieve the Senior PS (in that Event “A” Final), in **Neutral Conditions** at the GP2, Penrith NSW (15th – 19th February 2023)

6.2 The assessment of neutral conditions and the final decision of whether any Athlete/Crew has demonstrated the ability to achieve PS is in the absolute discretion of the Selection Panel, based on the influence of external conditions that may either positively or negatively influence the ability of an Athlete/Crew to achieve the PS. Such conditions may include, but not be limited to, wind speed/direction, water temperature, wave size and currents.

7. CANCELLATION / POSTPONEMENT OF A SELECTION COMPETITION

7.1 Prior to cancellation of any Selection Competition or Event, Paddle Australia will investigate all opportunities to postpone and/or re-schedule that Competition or Event for the purpose of allowing the selection process to proceed.

7.2 If the Selection Competition or Event is cancelled, and there is no reasonable opportunity to re-schedule the Competition or Event, then the Selection Panel may select athletes at their absolute discretion.

8. SELECTION ANNOUNCEMENT, CONTINUING FORM AND PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT

8.1 Announcement of the Team will be made within 1 week after GP 2, subject to the completion of the selection process by competing at the 2023 Paddle Australia Canoe Sprint Championships.

8.2 Athletes must accept the offer of selection as outlined in the Policy.

- 8.3 Any Athlete selected to the Team who fails to meet the Continuing Form, Fitness and Medical Assessment may be removed from the Team, at the discretion of the National Performance Director.

The 2023 Performance Standards have been based on an analysis of the 2012-2022 World Championship and Olympic Games results. The standards are based on the slowest times required to make the "A" Final. By averaging across multiple years, the effects of adverse or advantageous environmental conditions are effectively negated, with more years included resulting in the likelihood of a more accurate reflection of neutral conditions. Performance Standards are therefore expected to be achievable in what is considered environmentally neutral conditions (Fresh water, 25°C Water temperature, 0.0 m/s wind strength).
